


Carbon Fibre Chassis

The next step in the progression of your car design could be 'CHASSIS MODIFICATION'

In the diagram below, we have shown a simple development for that can be produced using composite material. (ask your teacher for more information) This is constructed using four materials;

- 1. Pre-impregnated composite carbon, for rigidity and strength
- 2. Resin film, to bond the carbon to the core material
- 3. **Core material,** This can be honeycomb nomex, Alloy or even a foam core.
- 4. **Core filler**, to provide internal support where fixings can go although this is not totally essential.



From the diagram you can see that this forms a simple composite laminated structure that can be cut roughly to shape prior to manufacture then cut and trimmed up later to exact size with simple hand or machine tools.
